

REFLEXION:

Una vez más Jesús afirmará que el tiempo de su glorificación está cerca, y entre las cosas que les enseñaba está lo que llama el nuevo mandamiento. Jesús estaba a punto de ser glorificado y esta gloria a la cual se refería era su muerte en la cruz del Calvario. Jesús nos da un mandamiento nuevo: "Que os améis unos a otros; como yo os he amado". "En esto conocerán todos que sois mis discípulos, si tenéis amor los unos por los otros". Es un mandamiento nuevo acerca de cuál debe ser nuestra prioridad como cristianos en este regalo de vida que Dios nos ha dado: Que nos amemos los unos a los otros, como Jesús nos ha amado. ¿A quién amamos? A nuestras familias, nuestros amigos, nuestra Iglesia. Muchas veces este amor es factible. Pero el mandamiento que Jesús nos da va mucho más allá. Jesús dice: "Que se amen como yo los he amado." ¿Cómo ama Jesús? Jesús está hablando mientras que Judas está saliendo de la escena para traicionarlo. El amor de Jesús incluye a Judas. Jesús ama a sus enemigos tal como ama a sus amigos. Y nos dice: "Amense los unos a los otros como yo los he amado." Es decir, ama a todos, aun a tus 'enemigos' Desde la Cruz donde estuvo sangrando, Jesús oró por ellos diciendo: "Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen". Jesús nos llama a amar a todos, como El nos ha amado: plenamente, abundantemente, sin límites, sin excluir siquiera a quienes tal vez nos parezca que no lo merecen; y debemos amarlos con el Amor de Dios, sin restricciones. Esto es lo que significa "gracia." Gracia es amor dado gratuitamente. El Amor de Dios es gratis, contagioso y no excluye a nadie, sí quieres entrar en el Reino de Dios es libre. No tienes que pagar porque Cristo ya pagó la entrada por nosotros. No importa el pasado, todos somos bienvenidos al Reino de Dios. El amor es mucho más que un sentimiento. Es dar tu vida por otros, es servir a otros. Amar es entregarte. Jesús dio este mandamiento justo cuando estaba terminando de lavarles los pies a sus discípulos. Fue un acto de servicio, de humillarse y actuar como servidor. Jesús lavó los pies de sus discípulos, incluyendo los pies de Judas. Jesús no hace acepción de personas. Su amor no excluye a nadie. El amor es acción. Dios nos perdonó y nos liberó y sigue amándonos todos los días y justamente por esto podemos amar al prójimo.
