



REFLEXION:

La Iglesia ha nacido con este fin: propagar el reino de Cristo en toda la tierra para la gloria de Dios Padre, y hacer así a todos los hombres partícipes de la redención salvadora y por medio de ellos ordenar realmente todo el universo hacia Cristo. Toda la actividad del Cuerpo místico dirigida a este fin recibe el nombre de apostolado, el cual la Iglesia lo ejerce a través de todos sus miembros, aunque de diversas maneras. En efecto, la vocación cristiana es, por su misma naturaleza, una vocación también al apostolado. En el Cuerpo místico de Cristo, que es la Iglesia "todo cuerpo crece según la operación propia de cada uno de sus miembros". Cada integrante de este cuerpo sea la que sea su misión, tiene que sembrar la semilla de Cristo a través de su apostolado. Es tan estrecha la conexión y trabazón de los miembros en este Cuerpo, que el miembro que no contribuye según su propia capacidad al aumento del cuerpo entero debe reputarse como inútil pará la Iglesia y para sí mismo. Jesús manda a estos setenta y dos discípulos por delante de El para preparar el camino en aldeas y pueblos específicos, en esto se parecía a la misión de Juan el Bautista, quien preparó el camino para el Mesías llamando a la gente a que se arrepintiera de sus pecados y cambiaran su manera de pensar y de vivir. Quizás, al igual que los doce discípulos, estos mensajeros no fueran los más aptos para esta misión. No eran personas "importantes" ante la sociedad; sin embargo, fueron elegidos por Jesús. No sólo porque habían sido testigos de los prodigios, milagros, enseñanzas, amor y misericordia de Cristo, sino porque ellos mismos habían experimentado el amor y la redención que Jesús ofrece. Aquellos hombres creyeron en Jesús y en el poder del Espíritu, y eso fue lo que los hizo aptos para la misión. La alegría de la misión cumplida no nos puede sacar del contexto de lo que es verdaderamente importante: "Dar a conocer a Cristo", su nombre está escrito en el libro de la vida y ahora todos ellos, a los que se ha evangelizado, son ciudadanos de los cielos.
