From the Pastor's Desk

Feast of Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus - July 2025

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I try to rediscover a regular rhythm of life following recent family events, one of the things I want to be sure to try to renew is my commitment to this bulletin column. I know that many of you actually do read it! Thank you for your attention to what is written here (as well, of course, to what is preached from the ambo during Mass!). Thank you for your patience as I continue to adjust to "the new normal" in my life.

As a corollary to that, I also want to thank all of you for your graciousness to me following the death of my mother, Gloria. So many of you offered Mass cards, memorial gifts, and prayers for the happy repose of her soul; I was also profoundly touched by everyone who offered me assistance and kindness, too. Needless to say, the last few months (years!) have not been easy. But I believe in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ! And that, at the end of the day, is what we base our hope upon, especially in the midst of grief. It does not make the losses that we suffer any less acute, but it does remind us that death will not have the last word.

Saint Martha's reputation sometimes unjustly suffers based on the Gospel passage we heard last weekend, but her interaction with the Lord following the death of her brother, Lazarus, demonstrates the depth of her faith in her Savior and ours, and she helps us find the words to say when we struggle with our own grief. In that brief passage from the Fourth Gospel, "Jesus said to [Martha], 'Your brother will rise again.' Martha said to him, 'I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world'" (John 11:23-27).

Yes, Lord. We believe this. Help us to act like we do, even in grief, by never abandoning the hope to which you call us (cf. Eph. 1:18).


FAMILY FAITH FORMATION— REGISTRATION NOW OPEN!

Fiesta de los Santos Marta, María y Lázaro - Julio de 2025

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Mientras intento redescubrir un ritmo de vida regular después de los recientes acontecimientos familiares, una de las cosas que quiero renovar es mi compromiso con esta columna del boletín. Sé que muchos de ustedes realmente la leen. iGracias por su atención a lo que aquí se escribe! (Y, por supuesto, también a lo que se proclama desde el ambón durante la Misa). Les agradezco su paciencia mientras continúo adaptándome a esta "nueva normalidad" en mi vida.

Relacionado con eso, también quiero agradecerles a todos por su amabilidad hacia mí tras el fallecimiento de mi madre, Gloria. Muchos de ustedes ofrecieron tarjetas de Misa, donativos conmemorativos y oraciones por el Eterno descanso de su alma. También me conmovió profundamente cada persona que me brindó ayuda y cariño. No hace falta decir que los últimos meses (io años!) no han sido fáciles. Pero yo creo en la Resurrección de Jesucristo. Y esa, al final del día, es la base de nuestra esperanza, especialmente en medio del duelo. No elimina el dolor de nuestras pérdidas, pero sí nos recuerda que la muerte no tendrá la última palabra.

La reputación de Santa Marta a veces sufre injustamente por el pasaje del Evangelio que escuchamos el fin de semana pasado. Sin embargo, su encuentro con el Señor tras la muerte de su hermano Lázaro demuestra la profundidad de su fe en nuestro Salvador, y nos ayuda a encontrar palabras cuando luchamos con nuestro propio dolor. En ese breve pasaje del cuarto Evangelio, "Jesús le dijo [a Marta]: 'Tu hermano resucitará.' Marta le respondió: 'Sé que resucitará en la resurrección en el último día.' Jesús le dijo: 'Yo soy la resurrección y la vida. El que cree en mí, aunque muera, vivirá; y todo el que vive y cree en mí no morirá jamás. ¿Crees esto?' Ella le dijo: 'Sí, Señor, yo creo que tú eres el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios, el que debía venir al mundo''' (Juan 11, 23-27).

Sí, Señor. Lo creemos. Ayúdanos a vivir como si realmente lo creyéramos, incluso en el duelo, sin abandonar jamás la esperanza a la que nos llamas (cf. Ef 1, 18).
