



# noticias de nuestra comunidad hispana

#### **REFLEXION:**

En este III Domingo de Pascua, seguimos felices disfrutando de la Resurrección de Jesús con amor y misericordía. San Juan nos narra en su evangelio la tercera aparición de Jesús a sus discípulos después de resucitar de entre los muertos. Su Pasión invadió a la tierra de confusión, pero Jesús resucita y con Él, la luz. Viene a la orilla del mar, y los encontró faltos de fe, estaban Pedro que lo negó, Tomás que dudó y Juan el discípulo amado, les habla como a niños asustados, porque ellos no creían que hubiera resucitado en su cuerpo y tenían que verlo sometido a las necesidades de la vida. Es ese mismo mar donde conquistó el corazón de Pedro, Andrés, Santiago y Juan; les preparó una comida con pescado y pan, pero este evento es totalmente diferente: aquí hay tristeza, melancolía y niebla; una niebla que les impide reconocer que es el Señor. Sólo Juan, en ese llamado del amor, lo reconoce. Y después de comer, Jesús pregunta a Pedro por su amor. Las tres interpelaciones a Pedro sobre su amor recuerdan las tres negaciones de la Pasión; pero sus negaciones, sus miserias, su debilidad, no impiden que pueda ser escogido como el guía, escogido para pastorear su rebaño. No es el discípulo perfecto, pero su amor al Señor ha curado su pasado. Juan nos narra en su evangelio que todo se cura con el amor y es así como se vive la experiencia de la Resurrección del Señor, porque en sus apariciones Jesús se hace presente pidiendo amor y dando amor. El mira siempre con amor. Nos pide algo y nos da una misión. Amar es ante todo una experiencia profunda de relación entre personas, donde existe una mezcla de sentimientos y valores como alegría, tristeza, sufrimiento, crecimiento, renuncia, entrega, realización, donación, compromiso, vida, muerte, etc. Si después de todo este camino que hemos hecho nos preguntara Jesús: "¿Me amas más que los demás que trabajan contigo, o más que tus hermanos, o más que tu propia vida?" ¿Cuál sería tu respuesta? ¿Podrías decir que tu amor a Jesús es notorio en la comunidad y entre los miembros de tu casa?
