From the Pastor's Desk

On the first Sunday of October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates "Respect Life Sunday." This observance began in 1972, when the bishops of our country sought to reaffirm the Church's perennial defense of innocent life in the face of legalized abortion. Over the years, its scope has broadened to embrace the safeguarding of the dignity of all human life, "from conception to natural death." To span the whole of human existence is to remember that our lives are in the hands of God:

"See now that I, I alone, am he, and there is no god besides me. It is I who bring both death and life, I who inflict wounds and heal them, and from my hand no one can deliver" (Deut 32:39).

It is not ours to take that role from God. For this reason, Saint John Paul II reminded us: "The direct and voluntary killing of an innocent human being is always gravely immoral" (Evangelium Vitae, 57).

But "respecting life" cannot be limited to the extremes of birth and death. Over the years of my priesthood, people have sometimes said to me, "Well, at least I didn't kill anyone!" when speaking about the state of their souls. While I am always relieved to hear that, surely we are called to a higher standard. Respecting life means more than refraining from taking it. It means reverencing every human being — in speech, in thought, in attitude, and in action.

We live in a time when political violence and rhetoric are on the rise. Words, too, must respect life. What we say, what we post, what we "like" or share online can contribute either to healing or to harm. Stirred-up passions quickly run out of control; it is all too easy to wound with our words. The Christian response must be the one given to us by the Savior himself: "Love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you" (Matt 5:44). To rejoice in the harm, humiliation, or death of another human being — any human being — is entirely opposed to the Gospel and must never be done by Christians.

Before we speak, before we post, before we share, we do well to ask: **Does this respect the dignity of all human life, from conception to natural death?** In fact, these are excellent questions for an examination of conscience:

- Do I respect others, even when they disagree with me?
- Do I represent my Christian faith well by how I speak and act?
- Do I remember that Christ is encountered in "the least of these" (Matt 25:40)?
- Am I truly living as an "ambassador for Christ" (2 Cor 5:20)?

Respect Life Sunday — and the whole month of October — invites us to reflect deeply on these questions. Our respect for life is shown not only in what we oppose, but in how we love.

On a lighter note, the priests of the Diocese of Charlotte will be gathering this week for retreat at Lake Junaluska, from Sunday afternoon through Friday morning. Please know that we will be praying for all of you while we are away!





noticias de nuestra comunidad hispana

Desde el Escritorio del Párroco

El primer domingo de octubre, la Iglesia Católica en los Estados Unidos celebra el **"Domingo Respetemos la Vida."** Esta conmemoración comenzó en 1972, cuando los obispos de nuestro país reafirmaron la defensa perenne de la vida inocente frente a la legalización del aborto. Con el tiempo, su alcance se ha ampliado para abarcar la defensa de la dignidad de toda vida humana, "desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural." Al contemplar todo el arco de la existencia humana, recordamos que nuestras vidas están en las manos de Dios:

«Reconozcan que yo soy, yo solo, y que no hay otro dios fuera de mí. Yo doy la muerte y doy la vida; yo hiero y yo sano, y no hay quien libre de mi mano» (Dt 32,39).

Ese papel no nos pertenece a nosotros. Por esta razón, San Juan Pablo II nos recordó: «La eliminación directa y voluntaria de un ser humano inocente es siempre gravemente inmoral» (Evangelium Vitae, 57).

Pero "respetar la vida" no puede limitarse únicamente a los extremos de la existencia. A lo largo de mis años de sacerdocio, algunas personas me han dicho: "iBueno, por lo menos no he matado a nadie!" cuando hablaban de su conciencia. Aunque siempre me alegra oír eso, ciertamente estamos llamados a un estándar mucho más alto. Respetar la vida significa más que no quitarla: significa honrar a cada ser humano —con nuestras palabras, pensamientos, actitudes y acciones.

Vivimos en una época en que la violencia política y la retórica agresiva están en aumento. Nuestras palabras también deben respetar la vida. Lo que decimos, lo que publicamos, lo que "damos me gusta" o compartimos en las redes puede contribuir al bien o al mal. Cuando nuestras pasiones se encienden, fácilmente se nos escapa el control; y con la lengua se pueden causar heridas profundas. La respuesta cristiana debe ser la del mismo Salvador: *«Amen a sus enemigos y oren por los que los persiguen»* (Mt 5,44). Alegrarse del daño, la humillación o la muerte de otro ser humano —de cualquier ser humano— es totalmente contrario al Evangelio y nunca debe hacerse por un cristiano.

Antes de hablar, antes de publicar, antes de compartir, conviene preguntarnos: ¿Esto respeta la dignidad de toda vida humana, desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural? De hecho, son preguntas excelentes para un examen de conciencia:

- ¿Respeto a los demás, incluso cuando no están de acuerdo conmigo?
- ¿Represento bien mi fe cristiana con lo que digo y hago?
- ¿Recuerdo que Cristo se encuentra en "los más pequeños" (cf. Mt 25,40)?
- ¿Vivo verdaderamente como un "embajador de Cristo" (cf. 2 Cor 5,20)?

El Domingo Respetemos la Vida —y todo el mes de octubre— nos invita a reflexionar en serio sobre estas preguntas. Nuestro respeto por la vida se manifiesta no solo en lo que rechazamos, sino sobre todo en cómo amamos.

En una nota más alegre, los sacerdotes de la Diócesis de Charlotte nos reuniremos esta semana para nuestro retiro anual en Lake Junaluska, desde la tarde del domingo hasta la mañana del viernes. iSepan que estaremos orando por todos ustedes mientras estemos fuera!
